“Are There Different Types Of Programs?”

Pratt offers a variety of program types during the Fall, Spring, and Summer terms:

- ❑ Exchange Semester
 - ❑ One-to-one exchange of students between Pratt and the partner school. Instruction is led by faculty of the partner school
- ❑ Semester Programs
 - ❑ Available to Architecture and Interior Design Undergraduates for Rome and Copenhagen
- ❑ Summer Programs
 - ❑ Includes Copenhagen, Havana, Rome, Tokyo, Venice (number of weeks varies)
- ❑ Faculty Led
 - ❑ Grads and UGs may enroll in select Pratt courses that take place in Italy



“What Schools Can I Study At?”

- ❑ Pratt has exchange agreements with eighteen schools globally in Europe, Middle East, Asia, and Australia
- ❑ Each program is offered to specifically selected majors in both Graduate and Undergraduate studies
- ❑ Certain programs may only be available during the Fall, Spring, or Summer. Refer to the website for detailed program information

“What Semester Programs Are Offered?”

COPENHAGEN, DENMARK:

- ❑ Spring Semester only
- ❑ For Interior Design students

ROME, ITALY:

- ❑ Spring Semester only
- ❑ For Architecture students

“What Summer Programs Are Offered?”

COPENHAGEN, DENMARK:

- ❑ Open to Undergraduate / Graduate students
- ❑ Architecture, Communications Design, Fine Arts, Industrial Design, and Interior Design
- ❑ Seven weeks
- ❑ 7 credits

TOKYO, JAPAN: Planning and Urbanism

- ❑ Open to Graduate students in the Architecture program
- ❑ Two weeks
- ❑ 3 credits

VENICE, ITALY:

- ❑ Open to Undergraduate/Graduate students
- ❑ Fine Arts, Art History
- ❑ Six weeks
- ❑ 6-9 credits



“What Faculty Led Programs Are Offered?”

PRATT IN VENICE:

- ❑ Offers courses in Printmaking/Drawing, Painting, Art History of Venice, and Materials and Techniques of Venetian Art
- ❑ Program takes place in June and July
- ❑ Open to Undergraduate/Graduate students
- ❑ Led by Diana Gisolfi

PRATT IN ROME:

- ❑ Offers courses in architecture, urbanism, and design
- ❑ Program takes place in June (3 credit course)
- ❑ Open to Graduate Architecture and Urban Design students
- ❑ Led by Mark Rakatansky



“...*Eligibility Requirements?*”

Undergraduate

- ❑ GPA of at least 3.0
- ❑ Complete second year of study at Pratt
- ❑ Be a Junior during the exchange semester
 - ❑ Complete at least 58 credits
- ❑ Obtain no more than 97 credits total by the end of the exchange semester

Graduate

- ❑ GPA of at least 3.0
- ❑ Complete first year of study at Pratt



“...*Eligibility Requirements?*”

Transfer Students

- ❑ GPA of at least 3.0
- ❑ Be a Junior during the exchange semester
 - ❑ Complete at least 58 credits
- ❑ GPA reflecting at least one semester's attendance at Pratt
- ❑ Approval from Department Chair

Change of Major

- ❑ GPA of at least 3.0
- ❑ Not on academic probation at time of exchange
- ❑ Must have changed major by the semester before application
 - ❑ GPA and portfolio must reflect courses in that major
- ❑ Must have two full semesters remaining upon return to Pratt
 - ❑ Minimum 12 credits each semester



“How Do I Apply?”

Applications are completed through the Terra Dotta platform. All documents are submitted electronically at <https://pratt-sa.terradotta.com/> by logging in with your Pratt OneKey. An application can then be created for your first choice school. Then you can:

- Manage material submissions
 - Review program information
 - Receive announcements
 - Access learning content
 - Submit digitally signed documents
 - Complete application questionnaires

“What Do I Need to Submit?”

Learning Content

- Critical info relevant to studying abroad
- You are required to review all documents and confirm as “received”

Documents + Questionnaire

- FERPA release form
- Digitally signed document for release of personal info to be reviewed by Education Abroad Administration
- Transcript upload (unofficial)
- Program selection (top 3 choices)

Statement of Interest

- Describe personal travel experience
- Reason for desire to participate
- Why you want to study at your selected schools



“Will I Still Graduate On Time?”

Absolutely! Pratt programs guarantee that students will receive full credit for an exchange term at the host school equivalent to a semester at Pratt.

This is determined by completion of the PEX-400 document. You will be credited for the Pratt courses listed on this form, even if you will be studying less hours at the host school than you would at Pratt.
